# **Celia Street Residents' Association**

**What is a Residents' Association?**

Residents' associations are formed by groups of people from a specific geographic community who come together to address issues within their local area and act as a voice for their local community.

**Membership**

Anyone interested in his or her local community can and should join a residents' association. Membership is normally open to all local people residing in a defined area (such as a suburb). They represent the interests particularly of those who are socially excluded because of ill health, low income, language and cultural differences, or age.

**About Celia Street Residents' Association.**

Although there has been community involvement in the area for about 30 years Celia Street Residents' Association started in March 2006 when The Hector-Argos-Miranda Tenants' Association (HAMTA) and The Groves Tenants Association merged.

The area covered by the association is situated at the north end of Liverpool, sandwiched between the main part of Kirkdale (L4) and Sefton (L20).

The area is relatively small consisting of twelve streets namely;

Argos Place	Marsh Street	St Alexandra Close
Celia Street	Miranda Place	St. Richards Close
Christmas Street	Miranda Road South	Stewart Grove
Malcolm Grove	Rosalind Way	Store Street

We cover a total of 400 homes consisting of properties owned by Liverpool Mutual Homes, Liverpool Housing Trust, owner occupiers and private landlords.

We are in regular contact with social landlords and most of the statutory and voluntary agencies keeping them informed of local environmental and anti-social behaviour issues and, therefore, helping to develop a safe, healthy and community based neighbourhood. A number of these agencies/groups fund local events.
